







SESSION INFORMATION

Each of the traditional Camp Massapoag sessions are listed below along with the dates they run and each week's program theme.

CAMP MASSAPOAG (Rising Grades 1-6)

Massapoag campers are placed in groups organized by grade. These campers will be assigned to a village for the summer. Campers swim everyday and will rotate through all specialty areas during the week. Special events, weekly camp-wide activities and dress up days create diverse experiences within the general camp routine.

SCAMPER CAMP (Rising Grade K)

Scamper groups are coed. Scampers will be supervised at a 5:1 camper to staff ratio and must be 5 by their 1st day of camp to be eligible to attend. Scampers will swim daily and participate in all Massapoag activities.

PIONEER CAMP (Rising Grades 7-8)

Teens enrolled in Pioneer Camp will have programming that respects their age, and challenges teens to be role models for younger campers and leaders among their peers. Pioneers are given additional privileges at camp and more freedom than other campers. Staff assignments are more consistent in Pioneer Camp.

LEADERS-IN-TRAINING (Rising Grades 9-10)

Our Leaders-in-Training (LIT) sessions include safety certifications, leadership development, hands-on experience and an overnight on Aug 18-19. LITs must submit an LIT Application in order to register. Applications are mandatory for all LITs. See LIT application for more details.

IMPORTANT CAMP FAQs

What happens on my first day?

Our YMCA Camp Staff will do all we can from the first moment to comfort your child, ease fears and help make the first day (and every day) a positive experience. Especially for younger campers, camp can be an overwhelming experience. The best thing we can do is to make sure every camper knows that our staff are friendly and eager to answer any questions they may have. Please help us reinforce the practice of asking where to go, what to do, where to place belongings, etc. Also, please have campers on time for the bus and properly prepared for camp. Try to have your child ready early for their first day. Once they arrive at camp, the welcome process begins before campers step off the bus. Our friendly staff greet campers in their seats on the bus and make sure they know where to go before they set foot on camp grounds. Your child will be introduced to his/her counselor and meet the campers in his/her group at their cabin. From there, all campers will meet around the flag pole for morning flag ceremony followed by morning assembly. After morning assembly, groups are dismissed to begin daily programming.

PLEASE PUT YOUR CAMPER'S NAME ON EVERYTHING

WHAT SHOULD I BRING TO CAMP?

What to wear:

- Play clothes (campers WILL get dirty at camp)
- Closed-toe shoes 

What to pack:

- Sandals (permitted at the waterfront ONLY)
- Change of clothes
- Lunch (With Plenty Of Snacks!)
- Water bottle (with LOTS of water)
- Swim suit & Towel (one-piece suits required for girls; t-shirt must be worn over two-piece suits)
- Two healthy snacks
- Sunscreen & Bug Spray
- Clothing/props for that week's theme

WHAT SHOULD I LEAVE AT HOME?

The following items are NOT permitted at camp or on the bus:

- Personal flotation devices & water toys
- Gum
- Toys, electronic games, trading cards, radios, mp3 players, iPods, cell phones
- Jewelry, watches, or items of personal or financial value
- Weapons or illegal substances
- Umbrellas
- Fireworks


Camp Massapoag cannot be responsible for any personal or athletic equipment that is brought to camp.

If special items are needed it will be stated in our weekly Mooseletter.

DO CAMPERS NEED MONEY AT CAMP?

The camp store sells drinks and snacks and camp swag! Snacks cost 50¢ and drinks cost \$1. To prevent children from handling money, set up a **CAMP STORE ACCOUNT**. Each Monday give the counselor at the bus or at camp your money in a sealed envelope marked with your child's name and "camp store" on the front. You can also call the Camp Office to add money to your camper's account. The Camp Store will **NOT** accept cash directly from campers. Unused money at the end of the summer will become a system credit on your account.

The camp store will be open throughout the day as well as during lunch time.



HOW DOES LUNCH WORK?

All campers are required to bring their own lunch and drinks. The lunch should be packed in an insulated lunch bag with an ice pack. Frozen juice boxes and water bottles keep the lunch fresh and provide extra liquids for hot days. Please put your camper's name on the outside of the lunch bag.

Camp staff will not heat up lunches for campers.

How do we keep camp clean?

We are blessed with a beautiful natural setting in which we host our camp experience. We will ALL take responsibility for keeping Camp Massapoag a beautiful and clean summer camp.

Please reinforce this important value with your child(ren) whenever possible.



IMPORTANT CAMP FAQs

Can parents visit Camp Massapoag during the day?

Visitors are always welcome during the camp day! Please follow these procedures for visiting camp:

- Inform your child that you will be visiting and call the camp office.
- Check in at the office immediately upon arrival. We will take you to your child's group. For camper safety and staff peace-of-mind, visitors MUST be escorted at all times while on camp property.

Why are Photo IDs important?

To ensure camper safety, we will release campers only to authorized adults on your Camper Registration Form. Adults picking up campers must present a Photo ID in order for campers to be released. To help expedite the pick-up process, please have your Photo ID ready at camp and bus stops.

How will I know which bus is mine?


At the end of the day, camper names will be called for each bus. Attendance is taken by the bus monitor on each bus. Buses do not leave camp property until all children are accounted for. Bus monitors will be present on each bus. Be sure your child knows their bus stop. Encourage them to speak with any of the staff if they don't know which bus they should board.

NOTE: Register for any bus assignment(s) you'd like. However, changes to bus assignments CANNOT be made during the week your child is attending camp. Call the Camp Office for more information about this policy. If circumstances require you to pick your child up directly from camp, please review the Parent Pick-up Information for more details.

LOST AND FOUND?

EVERYTHING should be plainly marked with camper's name in permanent ink. Please use first and last name in a very visible area on all clothing, towels, backpack, lunchbox and anything else brought to camp. The lost and found storage area is accessible to campers. Campers may ask staff for assistance. Lost and found is open to parents during camp hours.

NOTE: All items not claimed are periodically donated.



Tell me about Stay-Lates!

Stay-Lates will be offered on Friday of weeks 2, 4, & 6 for campers in rising grades 1st - 8th. Campers will enjoy swimming, games & activities, camp songs, and dinner. Stay-Lates are from 4pm-9pm. Parent pick-up is from 8:45pm-9:00pm. Permission slips will be sent home on the Monday prior to each Stay-Late. Each Stay-Late is an additional fee of \$15. Permission slips and fees should be returned by Thursday to the Camp Office. Once registered for a Stay-Late, no refunds are given. If a camper has a behavior incident report during the week, he/she will NOT be allowed to attend the Stay-Late.

How often will my child swim at the waterfront?

Our waterfront program is supervised by certified lifeguards, as well as additional staff watching from the water's edge. All campers will have one swim period per day. If campers do not wish to swim, they will be encouraged but not forced. Campers who do not swim will remain on the beach under staff supervision.

The swim ability of each camper is assessed on the first day of each session to determine their swimming level and comfort. Campers in the 2nd (orange) pool and deep (purple) pool will be given a colored bracelet that indicates his/her swimming ability. For your child's safety, please do not remove the bracelet. All swimmers without bracelets will swim in the shallow (pink) pool. Bring a swim suit* and towel to camp every day.

Reminder: Personal floatation devices and toys are prohibited.



*One-piece swim suits are required for girls, t-shirts must be worn over two-piece suits.

BUS TRANSPORTATION

Photo ID is required at pick-up time. No child will be released to anyone whose name is not on the camper's Registration Form unless the Camp Office is notified in writing. Please arrive at the bus stop 10 min before the scheduled bus arrival time and wait 10 min after the scheduled time to be sure you do not miss the bus. YMCA Camp Massapoag is not responsible for any child left unattended at a bus stop in the morning. Any child who is not met at the bus stop in the afternoon will be taken to Extended Care at the Lowell YMCA. Campers are not left alone at bus stops and the bus does not wait. There is a \$5 fee every time your child needs to go to Extended Care.

If you would like your child to walk home from the bus, please notify the camp in writing. YMCA Camp Massapoag works with the bus company to ensure safety and efficiency. Bus times are subject to change. The camp has contact with the bus dispatcher for emergencies. Though families may register for different AM & PM bus stops, registered stops may NOT be changed during the week of attendance. To make changes to busing call the camp office **PRIOR TO** the registered week. Inappropriate bus behavior can result in loss of busing. Gum, food, and drinks are not allowed at any time on the bus. Bus monitors are present on each bus.

Stop A- Treble Cove Plaza, Billerica: Located at the corner of Boston Road and Treble Cove Road in Billerica. Bus will pick up at Starbucks.

Stop B- TJ Maxx Plaza, Chelmsford: Located on Chelmsford Street across from Stop & Shop. Bus will pick up outside of TJ Maxx.

Stop C- McAnespie Park, Dracut: Located on Lakeview Ave near Nashua Road across from Dracut Funeral Home. Bus will pick up at rest area on the left side of the parking lot.

Stop D- Hannaford, Dracut: Located on the corner of Hildreth Street and Pleasant Street in Dracut. Bus will pick up under Hannaford sign in far end of the parking lot.

Stop E- Tyngsboro Middle School, Tyngsboro: Located on Norris Road in Tyngsboro. Bus will pick up in front of the school's main entrance.

Stop F- Lawrence Library, Pepperell: Located on Main Street in Pepperell. Bus will pick up near the exit of the parking lot.
*Note: Please pull around and park in the spaces closest to the exit.

Stop G- Stadium Plaza, Tewksbury: Bus will pick up on the K-Mart side of the parking lot.

Stop H- McCarthy Middle, Chelmsford: Located on North Road in Chelmsford next to the Chelmsford Police Station. Bus will pick up in front of the school's main entrance.

Stop I- Roudenbush, Westford: Located on Main Street in Westford. Bus will pick up outside entrance to the community center.

Stop J- Rogers School, Lowell: Located on Highland Street in Lowell across from the Lowell YMCA. Bus will pick up in front of the school's main entrance.

Stop K- Summer Village, Westford: Located on Summer Village Road in Westford. Bus will pick up at main entrance.

PARENT PICK-UP

Parent pick-up at Camp Massapoag takes place between 4PM and 4:15PM. Campers not picked up by 4:20 will go to Extended Care and a \$5 fee will be applied to your account. **PHOTO ID is required for pickup EVERYDAY.**

For everyone's safety we ask that you schedule pick-ups prior to 3PM or after 4PM. PLEASE DO NOT ENTER CAMP PARKING AREA WHILE BUSES ARE PRESENT.

If you plan on picking your camper up prior to 3PM, send a note with your child in the morning or call as early in the day as possible so we can provide you with the most convenient service. All early pick-ups take place in the Camp Office. Photo ID is required for campers to be released from camp. No camper will be released to anyone whose name does not appear on his/her Camper Release on the Registration Form. Parents must send specific written instructions to the Camp Office to alter camper authorization information.

PARENT DROP-OFF

We offer a convenient drive-thru drop-off daily from 8:45AM-9:00AM.

After 9:00AM all campers must be signed in at the Camp Office.

EXTENDED CARE

Extended Care is available for an additional fee at Camp Massapoag, the Lowell YMCA, and the Roudenbush Community Center in Westford.

@ Massapoag: Care starts at 7AM and Pick-up ends at 6PM.

@ Lowell YMCA: arrive between 7AM and 8AM. Pick-up is between 5PM and 6PM.

@ Roudenbush: Call (978) 692-5511 for cost and Registration Information.

@ YMCA and Massapoag: Please drop-off campers no earlier than 7AM and pick-up no later than 6PM.

Late pick-ups are billed at \$1/minute. Fees will be billed to your account and due that same Friday.

Persistent late pick-ups/late payment will result in loss of extended care.

PAYMENT AND CHANGES IN SERVICE

Payment

Visa, M/C, or AMEX can be called in to the Camp Office. Cash, Checks or M.O.'s can be processed at the Camp Office or Lowell YMCA Attn: Camp Massapoag. Please write your child's name on your check. Payments can also be made online. Final payment for each session/week is due two weeks prior to the start of each session/week. Check your account summary for due dates. Vouchers are accepted. Financial Assistance is available for families who qualify. Deadline to apply is April 15, 2016. Financial Assistance Applications can be found on the YMCA website or at the Lowell YMCA front desk. Camp fees (Registration, Membership, and Deposits) are non-refundable. Payment must be submitted for registered sessions and services regardless of attendance.

Session Changes/Cancellations

Changes/Cancellation With Two Weeks Notice or Greater:

If Cancelling Weeks- Full refund or credit, except for non-refundable Membership and Registration fees.

If Changing Weeks- All fees transferred to new weeks (If space is available).

Changes/Cancellation With Two Weeks Notice or Less:

If Cancelling Weeks- Refund or credit minus deposits and non-refundable Membership and Registration fees.

If Changing Weeks- All fees transferred to new weeks (If space is available).

Changes/Cancellation During Week of Camp:

If Cancelling Weeks- No refund will be given.

If Changing Weeks- No fees will be transferred to a new week and no prorates will be given.

HEALTH AND MEDICATION POLICIES

Your child's health and safety is our top priority. YMCA Camp Massapoag complies with Massachusetts Department of Public Health and YMCA standards. The following completed forms must be on file for each individual camper:

Camper Emergency Consent Form: An Emergency Consent Form containing medical history and emergency contacts with parent/guardian signature.

Physician Record Form: A Record of Physical Exam performed within 2 years, but no older than August 25, 2015 AND a current Immunization Record*.

Per Massachusetts CMR430.152(A), **Immunization History must be signed by a licensed healthcare provider and include:**

Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) Vaccine - minimum of two (2) doses is required

Polio Vaccine - minimum of three (3) doses of either IPV or OPV (4 if mixed) is required

Diphtheria/Tetanus Toxoids/Pertussis Vaccine - minimum of four (4) doses of DTaP/DTP/DT or at least three (3) doses of Td is required

Hepatitis B - minimum of three (3) doses is required

*Exceptions to these requirements may be made provided there is documentation of contraindicated immunizations and/or religious objections.

NOTE: Campers will not be permitted into camp without these forms on file.

Medication Policy

Over-the-counter and prescription meds, as well as Epi-Pens, inhalers and diabetic maintenance must be sent in original containers only and are locked in the Health Office. Any other non-oral medication must be discussed with the Camp Health Supervisor or Camp Director prior to enrollment. Prescription medication containers must have pharmacy label and contain only the medication listed on the label. Medication will be given only in prescribed dosages and schedules. Any changes from the label information must be authorized in writing by your child's doctor. **OTC meds** only need parent written permission to administer. **Prescription meds** require a specific consent form and must be on file at camp before medications can be given. Please contact the YMCA for the prescription meds consent form.

Head Lice

We have a strict NO NIT policy. Campers will be sent home immediately if eggs or lice are found. Campers cannot return if nits remain, even after treatment.

Camper Illness/Injury

In the event of any illness or injury other than a minor one, the parents or emergency contact person will be notified as soon as possible. Emergency medical personnel may be called to the scene in emergency situations.

NOTE: YMCA Camp Massapoag participants are not covered by accident insurance through the YMCA.

If a camper has a fever greater than or equal to 100°, a parent/guardian will be contacted and asked to pick up their camper as soon as possible. The camper may return to camp after 24 hours of no fever.

Emergency Policy

Camp Massapoag has established emergency procedures for severe weather, fire, and missing campers. Safety drills are held regularly. If an official "State of Emergency" is declared, we will be in contact with local authorities and comply with their direction and instructions.

BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT POLICY

It is important that we take appropriate action to make sure your child and other children remain safe and happy while at camp. Our behavior management plan begins with positive reinforcement to strengthen camper character and prevent inappropriate behavior from taking place.

Our Five Rules Of Camp are revisited every morning at assembly.



5 Rules Of Camp

1. Safety First
2. Listen And Follow Directions
3. Try Everything And Do Your Best
4. Do What's Right
5. Have Fun!



Campers that fail to follow camp rules are treated fairly and appropriately. All staff members have the support of experienced directors to provide guidance and intervene if necessary.

Failure to comply with the rules will result in the following actions:

1st Action: Verbal warning

2nd Action: After verbal warnings for similar behavior, camper will spend extended time in the Camp Office participating in writing/drawing exercises acknowledging their behavior.

3rd Action: After Camp Office visits, a Director Incident Report will be filed by the Camp Director or designee. Parents will be contacted.

4th Action: After two Director Incident Reports are written, the Camp Director or designee will meet with the camper and his/her parent guardian to determine if a suspension or termination is necessary.

NOTE: A camper may be suspended or terminated immediately for severe behavior such as: physical violence, harm to other campers or staff, or attempts to leave the camp property. There will be no refund under these circumstances. Final determination regarding suspension and/or dismissal will be made by the Camp Director.

Dismissal from Camp

Dismissal from camp will occur after a conference with the parents, camper, and camp director. If a camper is dismissed for disciplinary measures due to severe behavior, no refund will be issued for the unused days. Contact the Camp Director regarding special circumstances in which a refund may be appropriate.

Camp Management reserve the right to dismiss a camper (without refund) when the child's behavior has been deemed inappropriate, disruptive, or unsafe to themselves or others.

CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT AT YMCA CAMP MASSAPOAG

YMCA Camp Massapoag is focused on nurturing the potential of every child and teen. We provide activities that benefit children physically, emotionally and spiritually. Activity and event plans are made on a foundation of character development. It is our goal to help campers discover the strength of their character through their experiences with us at camp. The code of conduct for campers and staff is based on the core character values of Honesty, Caring, Respect, and Responsibility. Recognition and discipline practices are utilized using this language.



DIRECTIONS TO YMCA CAMP MASSAPOAG



YMCA Camp Massapoag | 234 Hall Street | Dunstable, MA 01827

Route 3 to exit 35, Route 113. Follow Route 113 West into Dunstable Center. Bear left to continue following Route 113. After .75 miles (just before the gas station), turn left onto Groton Road. After Larter Field, bear left onto Hall Street. YMCA Camp Massapoag is on the left after the power lines.

From Groton: Take Chicopee Row until it turns into Groton Street in Dunstable. Take a right onto School Street and a right onto Hall Street. The camp entrance is on the left.

From Westford: Take Dunstable Road, following it over Route 40. Take a left onto Groton Road; it will become Island Pond Road. At the top of the hill, turn right onto Hall Street. Camp entrance is on the right.

FIRST DAY OF CAMP
